

Mayfield Town Council Meeting

August 16, 2017

Regular meeting of the Mayfield Town Council was held on August 16, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. at the Mayfield Town Hall, located at 52 North Main Street, Mayfield, Utah.

Regular Meeting – 7:00 p.m.

Mayor John Christensen called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone to council meeting.

Pledge of Allegiance was offered.

Prayer was given by Eric Peterson

Minutes for the month of July 2017 were presented to the council. After some discussion motion was made by Eric to accept the minutes as read for the month of July, seconded by Zara. Motion carried.

Bills were presented for payment for the month of August 2017. After reviewing the bills motion was made by Zara to pay the bills including the power bill. Seconded by Eric, motion carried.

Mayor Christensen updated the council on a letter he had signed of commitment to have Mayfield Town participate in the Six County Region Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Planning Process.

Catherine went over the financial report with the council. She also discussed with the council several items contained in their packets.

Catherine asked the council if they would like to participate in the Sanpete County Fair Car Show again this year. The council voted to pay the \$35.00 for the trophy for the winner.

Catherine talked to the council about a call she had received from the Utah Department of Transportation concerning our speed signs on highway 137. The agreement stated that Mayfield would pay ½ the cost of the signs which will be approximately \$4500.00. She stated that we would need to take that cost out of our Class C funds.

The council talked about the town cabins. There are several problems with the small cabin that would need to be repair so after some discussion the council decided to not rent the small cabin at this time.

Catherine stated that the Sanpete County Building Inspector had stopped by to have the town sign off on the Thomas Mahoney home. After talking to the inspector we need to put into place a check list and have Grant check before we sign off on a new home.

Aaron Peterson stated that he had talked to Jeff Bunker from the Utah Department of Transportation about the second entrance into the Mayfield Estates subdivision. He stated that Jeff said that it would be the responsibility of the subdivision owner, Aaron talked to J L Larsen and he said that because he had turned the roads over to the town it would now be our responsibility. Catherine said she would contact Jeff Bunker at UDOT.

Zara went over the new project at the cemetery. She stated that if we have problems with the new sprinkler system to please call the company that installed them. She went over several concerns about the water at the cemetery and she feels that the lawn is burning up. She stated that she would like the same sprinkler head used when one is replaced.

Zara also discussed with the council her concern that Richard Bjerregaard dug the grave for his son's remains without permission and that she felt that Van gave him permission. Van said that he told Richard to contact Zara to see if it would be ok. She stated that Richard was aware of the law and still dug the grave. She wants him to pay the opening and closing fee and also to be fined for not following the law.

Malynda presented the final survey for our General Plan, she asked the council to please review it and give her there feedback as soon as possible. She said that she would like to send it out by September 1st. The council discussed different ways to get the surveys out to the public.

Malynda also stated that she would like to have an incentive for the residents to get the survey back. Malynda made the motion to hold a town drawing with cash prizes totaling \$250.00 on November 2nd if you turn in your survey by October 1st, your name will be entered in twice to the drawing. If you turn your survey in from October 2nd to November 1st, your name will be entered once in the drawing. We will draw four names, one will receive \$100.00, and three will receive \$50.00 each. Seconded by Eric, motion carried.

The council discussed several concerns about our business licenses.
