

Mayfield Town Council Meeting

November 8, 2017

Regular meeting of the Mayfield Town Council was held on November 8, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. at the Mayfield Town Hall, located at 52 North Main Street, Mayfield, Utah.

Mayor John Christensen called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone to council meeting.

Pledge of Allegiance was offered.

Prayer was given by John Christensen.

Catherine presented the election results from the November 7th election to the council. For Mayor the results were John Paul Christensen 120 - Walt Jenkins 85 votes. Council members results were Eric A. Peterson 154 - Mike Bennett 134 - and Catherine Coulter 45 votes. Motion was made by Eric to accept John Paul Christensen as Mayfield Town Mayor and to accept Mike Bennett and Eric Peterson as our new councilmembers. Seconded by Zara, motion carried. (Roll call vote John - yes, Zara - yes, Eric - Yes and Aaron yes)

Malynda drew the names for the survey contest winners: Marcus Kupitz \$100.00, Randy Gale \$50.00, Eric Ludvigson \$50.00 and Janet Hanson Haight \$50.00.

Minutes for the month of October 2017 were presented to the council. After some discussion motion was made by Malynda to accept the minutes as read, seconded by Eric. (Roll Call Vote - John - Yes, Zara - Yes, Malynda - Yes - Eric - Yes).

Bills were presented for payment for the month of November 2017. After reviewing the bills motion was made by Aaron to pay the bills. Seconded by Eric, motion carried. (Roll Call vote Zara - Yes, John - Yes, Eric - Yes, Malynda - Yes).

Catherine presented the audit report that Kimball and Roberts has completed for the town. She went over several items in the report with the council. She asked the council to review the report and get back with her with any questions.

Catherine stated that the Christmas candy has been ordered and will be ready about the 1st of December. The mayor talked about the need for santa helpers for Christmas Eve.

Malynda updated the council on where we are on the general plan. She also went over with the council first survey synopsis results.

Malynda has the packets ready to hand out to individuals that we feel are qualified to write a introduction to the following areas, public service, parks and recreation, transportation, beautification vision etc. for our general plan.

Zara said that this next weekend they will pour the cement for the new gazebo at the cemetery.

John talked to the council about the culvert that is plugged on canyon road. The Fire Department came up on Monday and tried to get it going but couldn't get it unplugged. John said that when Van gets back he will have him pump the water out and unplug it.

Aaron asked about the second entrance into the Mayfield Estates. John said that UDOT is willing to go along with doing the entrance but the cost for the project has not been determined. John also went over what he is working on with UDOT to move the power poles in front of the town hall and the one by the church.

Melissa Judy from the Gunnison Valley High School is doing a Sub for Santa program and has contacted the Town for names in our community that could need help. John asked the council to let him know if they knew a family.

John talked to the council about the problems we have been having with our water meters. We have about 32 meters that are not reading. A representative from Master Meters is coming next week to figure out the problem. We may need to replace them but they are under warranty still.

The Fire Department came up last week and check all of our fire hydrants and there was only one that is not working. John is also going to have Sunrise make a map showing where all the hydrants are located for them to put in the fire trucks.
