

# *Mayfield Town Council Meeting*

## *January 11, 2017*

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Regular meeting of the Mayfield Town Council was held on January 11, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. at the Mayfield Town Hall, located at 52 North Main Street, Mayfield, Utah.

Mayor John Christensen called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone to council meeting.

Pledge of Allegiance was given by John P. Christensen

Prayer was given by Eric Peterson

Mr. and Mrs. Ken Davis was at the meeting to talk to the council about their plans to put in a Bunk House in part of the care center building. Malynda talked to them about our General Plan and what they would need to do before meeting with the Planning Commission.

Minutes for the regular meeting for the month of December were read. After reviewing the minutes motion was made by Aaron to accept the minutes with correction. Seconded by Zara, motion carried.

Bills were presented for payment for the month of January 2017. After reviewing the bills motion was made by Eric to pay the bills including the power bill. Seconded by Zara, motion carried.

Max White, from Whites Sanitation was present to meet with the council for their annual meeting. He asked the council if there were any concerns or problems that the town has had this past year. The council stated that they do a very good job and that we have little to no problems. Malynda asked about recycling and if Whites would be working towards that. Mr. White stated that at this time it is not cost affective for this area. Max also asked Catherine to call the office and set up our town clean-up dates for the summer.

John stated that he had talked to Van and the springs are producing more water at this time than they were last spring.

Malynda stated that the grant money for our General Plan will be funded by the CIB on February 2, 2017 in Salt Lake.

Aaron talked to the council about painting and doing some improvements at the town hall. He said that he felt he could get help and they could do most of the repairs needed. Aaron also discussed with the council what could be done to improve safety at the park and asked about purchasing good cameras for the park. He also discussed possible ideas for a river walk.

Closed Session - Motion was made by Aaron to go into a closed meeting. Pursuant to the Provisions of Section 52-4-5(1) of the Open Meeting Law for the purpose of (d) strategy sessions to discuss the purchase, exchange, or lease of real property, including any form of a water right or water shares, if the public discussion of the transaction would (i) disclose the appraisal or estimated value of the property under consideration; or (ii) prevent the public body from completing the transaction on the best possible terms. Seconded by Eric, motion passes with a vote of 5-0.

Malynda asked who we would need to contact about fixing the side road by Doug Bjerregaard. The Mayor stated that we would need to contact the State Road Department. Catherine said she would talk to Van about who to call.

The council discussed new street lights in town with LED lights. They talked about putting in streetlights that we could attach banners. They also discussed looking into grants for help with a main street beautification project.

Zara said that she had closed the cemetery for the winter. She also asked Catherine to order a few more signs for the cemetery.

Mayor Christensen talked to the council about projects that the town now have on the CDBG project list, and asked for their ideas on what they feel we need to accomplish as a town. The meeting is on January 19<sup>th</sup> to set our goals for the coming year.

The Mayor talked to the council about our safety speed sign up the canyon road. He had printed off graphs showing the number of cars that travel that road, the busiest time of the day and speed traveled.

Mayor Christensen also stated that the Sanpete County Fire District has passed a resolution #11-01-2016 amending the fees or charges for the commodities, services, and facilities provided by the Sanpete county Special Service District #2 from \$3.00 /month to \$3.50/month commencing December 1, 2016 then increasing from \$3.50 to \$4.00 /month commencing July 2, 2017.
