

Mayfield Town Council Meeting March 8, 2017

Regular meeting of the Mayfield Town Council was held on March 8, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. at the Mayfield Town Hall, located at 52 North Main Street, Mayfield, Utah.

Mayor John Christensen called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone to council meeting.

Pledge of Allegiance was offered.

Prayer was given by John Christensen.

Bill Jensen, Walt Jenkins and Scott Allred from the Mayfield Lions Club was present at the meeting to discuss with the council the park project they would like to do this summer. He stated that they would like to put in a BMX track and a fitness trail; they also had talked about new playground equipment. He went over the plans of what would need to be done to complete each project. Mayor Christensen said that he would have Catherine contact our insurance to see what their risk management department concerns were. After some discussion Eric made the motion to accept the plans for the projects depending on what the insurance recommends. Seconded by Zara. Motion carried.

Garrick Willden, our Engineer was at the meeting to finalize the spending of the remaining funds in our road project. He stated that we are putting in the culvert at the Estates and over at Andy Peterson's, purchasing a sprayer and the remaining will be spent on graveling the cemetery roads.

Jed Hansen the Gunnison Valley Fire Chief was at the meeting to go over with the council an agreement between Mayfield Town and the Utah Division of Forestry, Fire and State Lands. The agreement if approved will be for 5 years and with take effect on July 1, 2017. The

agreement is to protect the town if we have a wildland fire. The agreement states that this is a cooperative agreement between FFSL and Mayfield Town wherein the town agrees to meet a participation commitment and provide initial attack for wildland fire, and FFSL agrees to pay for wildland fire suppression cost following a Delegation of Fire Management Authority as found in Utah Code 65A-8-203.1. After reviewing the agreement motion was made by Eric to approve the agreement with the Forestry. Seconded by Aaron, motion carried.

Tommy Peterson , Sanpete County Fire Warden also talked to the council about the new formed Hazmat Team for Sanpete County.

Bills were presented for payment for the month of February. After reviewing the bills motion was made by Zara to pay the bills including the power bill and Questar gas. Seconded by Eric, motion carried.

The council reviewed Ordinance #2017-1 concerning delinquent water bills in town. After some discussion motion was made by Eric to approve the ordinance, seconded by Aaron. Motion carried. Roll call vote, Eric yes, Aaron Yes, Zara Yes.

The council also went over Resolution #2016-17-B and #2016-17-C appointing members to the Planning Commission and the Board of Appeals. After reviewing the resolution motion was made by Aaron to accept the resolution, seconded by Eric. Motion carried. Roll call vote, Eric Yes, Aaron Yes, Zara Yes.

Mayor Christensen stated that he had signed the agreement to move forward with our General Plan project. He said that he will sign the agreement for the \$15,000.00 grant with CIB tonight.

Zara updated the council on the projects she is working on at the cemetery. She said that she had Mike Madsen up to the cemetery and she would like to have him finish the roads by Memorial Day.

The Mayor said that he is meeting with the Six County this week on our 2 to 5 year improvement plan for the town. The council discussed several projects that they would like to see complete. The Mayor stated that the park in the Mayfield Estates subdivision is part of that plan.

John updated the council on the Rural Water Conference he attended to recertify his water operator certification. He also had Rural Water help him complete a report for the town that needs to be done annual. In the past we were only able to estimate the usage but the state now requires us to show exact usage. John said that he had talked to Sunrise about having radio read meters installed so we can meet the requirements for the state.

The Mayor discussed the General Plan and updated the council on the preliminary meeting that we had on February 22nd.

Malynda talked to the council about the survey that she is working on with Rural Community regarding our General Plan.
