#### DID YOU KNOW?

Recreation vehicles and mobile homes are prohibited – No mobile homes will be allowed in any area within Town. It shall be unlawful to place any rv/travel trailer/camper on any lot or parcel of land and to use the same for human habitation, except they may be placed on private property and used for human habitation if one of two conditions is met and a conditional use permit is obtained.
